The Lawyer Referral Service is operated from the Utah Law and Justice Center in Salt Lake City, utilizing members of the staff of the Utah State Bar. Persons seeking a referral to a lawyer should call the toll-free line maintained at the Bar office. A staff member will interview the caller and a referral will be made to a Lawyer Referral Service panel member. Clients will then contact the lawyer directly to set up an appointment and should expect to pay a fee of \$30 for an initial consultation, which will not exceed one-half hour. Any arrangements for further legal services and fees are subject to agreement between the client and the lawyer.
