The Harborview Center for Sexual Assault and Traumatic Stress, part of Harborview Hospital, offers services to prevent and counter the harmful effects of traumatic experiences on victims, families, and the community. Services include emergency medical care after sexual assault/abuse, including forensic examinations and consultation. There are no fees for emergency medical examinations. The Center also offers counseling services including: information and referrals, crisis counseling and support, and therapy groups for survivors of sexual assault. Initial appointments and groups are free of charge. Harborview Center for Sexual Assault and Traumatic Stress accepts most major insurance carriers to cover fees for other services. Survivors who are unable to pay may be eligible for reduced fee or free services through the Charity Care program.

Counselors are willing to meet with inmates to arrange for crisis intervention and other advocacy services. Advocacy and support groups are free of charge. Fees for therapy are based on a sliding scale, and most insurance is accepted. Individuals who have low or no income are eligible for free counseling. The 24-hour hotline accepts collect calls.

The Sexual Assault Center of Pierce County (SACPC) is a community-based agency that advocates for victims/survivors, their families, and friends. The Sexual Assault Center of Pierce County provides advocacy services free of charge to any victim/survivor of sexual assault or abuse, recent or past. The 24-hour crisis phone line connects survivors to an advocate to provide immediate assistance, information, emotional support, and medical and legal advocacy. SACPC also offers individual and couple counseling for survivors of sexual assault, abuse, and harassment, as well as for friends and families of survivors. Counseling services are available to female and male adolescents and adults. Therapy is based on a generous sliding fee scale, and no one is turned away for financial reasons. SACPC is willing to offer crisis intervention services to all survivors of sexual assault who contact them, but due to funding restrictions they cannot provide additional on-going services to survivors who have committed sexual offenses.

Spokane AIDS Network (SAN) is a community-based organization whose mission is to minimize the impact of, and maximize awareness about, AIDS and other consequences of HIV infection in the Inland Northwest. SAN works with all people infected with and affected by HIV/AIDS and those most at risk for contracting HIV in Spokane County and surrounding vicinities, including all 11 counties on the eastern side of Washington State. Case management services are available for clients when they are incarcerated. SAN can also provide general information and referrals by phone and by mail to survivors who are currently incarcerated. Services for survivors after release include HIV testing and counseling, case management, support groups, and food services for those who are eligible. Clients can also receive referrals to medical providers and case management support to access insurance. Support groups, information, referrals, and case management are offered to loved ones who reside in the same household as a SAN client who is HIV+. Translation services are available upon request. All services are free.

The Sexual Violence Law Center (SVLC) helps sexual assault survivors in King County by providing free and confidential legal assistance related to the sexual assault. SVLC provides direct legal representation to sexual assault victims in a variety of areas, including safety and privacy issues, immigration, employment, education, housing, and financial concerns. Survivors can also obtain publications such as “Know Your Rights: Information for Survivors of Sexual Violence” in English and Spanish; “Understanding the Sexual Assault Protection Order, A Step by Step Guidebook” in English and Spanish, or “A Survivor’s Guide to Filing a Civil Law Suit” in English on the website. SVLC also provides limited legal consultation, advocacy, information, resources, and referrals to attorneys for survivors of sexual abuse behind bars, either by phone or by mail.
