The initial visit will allow the client an opportunity to ask questions about legal problems, receive legal advice, and arrange for further legal work if necessary. Clients are not under any obligation to hire the attorney.

The Administrative Review Unit is responsible for reviewing, investigating, and responding to inmate misconduct and grievance appeals, which are submitted to the director for final review. This review is considered to be the last step in the internal administrative process. Inmates are required to exhaust their administrative remedies prior to filing litigation in the court system. The review conducted at both the facility and departmental level assists in preventing unnecessary litigation. Hundreds of inmate letters are received in Administrative Review every year with a response forwarded for each one received. The unit serves as a contact point for field staff, family members, and legislators who have questions regarding the department's disciplinary process and grievance process.
